COURSE FORMAT

This course is divided into four phases.

- Phase 1: ONLINE MODULES
- 65 hours, self-paced

Course Summary: This course addresses the complexities of treating patients with atrophic alveolar bone, focusing on variations like vertical and horizontal atrophy, bone density differences, and specific anatomical features. Attendees will learn a comprehensive approach to site classification, patient risk assessment, and optimal material and technique selection for successful 3D alveolar bone reconstruction.

Key topics include: Diagnosis & Risk Assessment: Classifying alveolar ridge types and assessing risks based on patient and site characteristics.

Material & Technique Selection: Covering autogenous, xenograft, allograft, alloplastic materials, and PRF for bone regeneration.

Biology of Regeneration: Understanding wound healing, osteogenesis, and growth factors.

Surgical Techniques: Detailed instruction on flap designs, regenerative techniques (e.g., block grafting, GBR), and suturing for effective wound stabilization.

Soft Tissue Management & Complications: Techniques like vestibuloplasty and PRF application, plus complication management.
